ORDINARY AGENDA:

1. Public Question Time – an opportunity for members of the public to address the Council on any Council matter before the meeting commences. (Limited to 10 minutes)

Christopher Berry – Nothing.

Geoff Cowling - None

Amanda Gillingham – update of Defibrillator for the year. Checked regularly by Amanda (chief guardian) and Michelle Burke (backup guardian). In working order. On the circuit nationally so that all are aware it is in place. Not yet used so far this year. PC are holding donation from Village Fair for use with Defib, could be used for new pads, training etc. Training generally held bi-annually so could be held in 2025. There is an online video on using a defibrillator that can be viewed by anyone in the meantime.

RW expressed his interest in attending a training course.

The defibrillator is located in a locked yellow cabinet attached to the outside wall of the Village Hall, to the left of the entrance door. The code to unlock box is C2589X. The defibrillator is registered with South West Ambulance Service. The defibrillator is simple to operate, just open it and follow the voice instructions.

Bill Moore – Speeding – BM spoke of his concerns regarding speeding through the Village and approach roads.

BM indicated that death on rural roads was more likely with speeding being a contributing factor. Drivers are possibly entering and leaving the Village in excess of 50mph. Since Covid there are more vans/lorries entering the Village and businesses have changed which has increased traffic.

AB following conversations with KW had recently asked Martin Rose (MR) the Principal Engineer from Wiltshire Council Highway Asset Management and

Commissioning if he thought Tockenham had a case to apply for a maximum 20mph speed limit who thought it was worth looking closely at the possibility. KW advised the meeting that to do this we would have to pursue this formally through LHFIG but having studied various official documents it would result in another Metro Count.

We have had three metro counts in recent times. Results from 2023 showed our seven-day 85%ile speed readings do not put us in the category of requiring a 20mph speed limit through the main built-up area of the Village.

For a 20mph speed limit to be considered our seven- day 85%ile speed would have to show that vehicles were reducing their speed to or below 24mph. BM suggested that we need to ask AB how we can make the Village safer. KW had sought advice on this matter with Perry Payne (Wiltshire & Swindon road safety partnership)

KW has compiled a list of all things that could concern residents whilst vehicles are moving through the village and will present this at a site meeting with AB and MR and see if the PC can find a way of moving forward and addressing the speeding concerns. KW will also ask if it is worth pursuing the 60mph national speed limit on approach roads could be considered being reduced to 40mph. Tractor movement - 19th April. Following the April Community Safety Meeting where KW had raised the issue that Tockenham residents were concerned that tractors were travelling to fast through the village KW was advised that the PC could if concerned in the future email the police. 19th April residents were concerned that there were a number of Tractors travelling through the village to fast and as a result unacceptable large quantities of Slurry were being distributed across the road. KW emailed the Police however no response was received until the next day after tractor movement had ceased. Police were given a registration number and indicated they would contact the contractors and ask for them to be considerate and respectful when using the village highways.

Perry Payne asked to be kept informed of our issues and problems with speed through the village and he will offer any advice to help.

KW has requested that the 60 mile per hour speed limit coming into the village be reduced to 40 miles per hour and this will be a separate application. AB will be asked to follow this up with Martin Rose to progress the application.

There is likely to be a site meeting with AB, Martin Rose, some villagers and KW feels this could progress.

Upnans - Bungalow at top of village as you leave, toward Lyneham, a new structure is being built (opposite Red Lion Cottage). Criteria for Class E building

states structure should not be more than 50% of the land left following building. There is also a height restriction. Does it need planning permission? **DK** to query

PL/2023/10812 comments on Clyffe Application for Traveller's Sites

Tockenham Parish Council oppose this application.

The main reason is the prospective increase of heavy vehicles driving through the small, pavement-less village of Tockenham

and its very narrow lanes. It would mean further increased damage to the road between West

Tockenham and Greenway. This part of the C120 is in dire need of road surface repairs and despite the Parish Council's formal attempts to resolve the matter we feel, with WC Highways stretched resources, the problem will get worse before it is given any attention. It would also mean increased damage to our verges which are being slowly eroded and destroyed by large vehicles.

We are also concerned about the scale of this development, so close to existing homes, and the impact it will have on the character and appearance of the current landscape.

We would also question the need to supply further Travellers Sites locally. We therefore object to this application."

8. Highway Matters

Topo survey – Tockenham – KW passed out details ready for the meeting next week, which option, 1 or 2 to accept for the new passing place at Rowley Copse. Although we can opt for one option, LHFIG will ultimately decide which or both options can be adopted. Tockenham will be required to pay 25% of the total cost of the new passing place. Meeting agreed that option 2 is the preferred option. Cost of £12k all agreed.

9. Play Area:

Feedback from JM on sinkage. JM has contacted a company in Devon but they have not responded despite reminders. DK asked all to see if they can find details of a company who may be able to find out if the sinkage is due to an old septic tank or not and how the issue can be resolved.

May have to consider roping off the area affected as there are more people/children using the park now the weather is improving.

JM advised that the bin near the park was emptied recently and she noticed the workman taking pictures of the contents. When asked why, he informed her that his boss required evidence of how much the bin is being used. If the bins are not used enough they may be taken away.
