TOCKENHAM PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL EXTRAORDINARY MEETING HELD ON Wednesday 2nd July 2025 at 7pm

Public Question Time

Reports from Wiltshire Councillor

Verbal report received from Wiltshire Councillor Allison Bucknell. Still waiting for the safety review of the A3102, no date had been given yet. AB will keep everyone up to date as and when further information is available. AB advised LHFIG additional funding has been agreed to £32,000. AB advised the temporary order speed limits are being assessed by Wiltshire Councillor Officers and the respective Wiltshire Councillors will bring an update to their Parishes in due course. The Wiltshire Councillors' starting point is they should remain but waiting for assessment results.

KW advised that he and Bill Moore gave a presentation to Wiltshire Council regarding Tockenham's Emergency Plan. AB advised Broad Hinton are currently doing their Emergency Plan; AB to provide Broad Hinton with KW contact details; KW has various links and information that can be passed onto Broad Hinton. KW advised the Emergency Plan is being updated because of the recent exercise. IC to become a coordinator. The Emergency Plan Annex C and the WhatsApp group are being updated. KW to get quotes for printing copies of the plan. Emergency Plan to be on the agenda as a standard item.

9. Highway Matters

20mph Speed Limit Assessment
 KW advised LHFIG had approved the 20mph Speed Limit Assessment. The cost of the

assessment is £3,100 with Tockenham Parish Council's contribution being £775.

RESOLVED to pay £775 contribution; proposed by DK, seconded by NP, agreed unanimously by all who were present.

Wiltshire Council Site Visit – 22nd May 2025

KW advised there was a site visit on 22nd May 2025 with KW, AB, Wiltshire Council Head of Drainage and Wiltshire Council Head of Highways in attendance. This was a review from the previous site visit; details of the issues reviewed are below:-

Tockenham Corner

Reviewed the work that had been done to dig out ditches and noted the considerable effort by residents however still concerns about how easily the road floods and the possibility of a new culvert under the road.

Due to the nature of the road, a scheme in this location would be unlikely to meet sufficient criteria to be prioritised.

Wiltshire Council Officers are of the opinion that digging the watercourses between the C130 and C120 would likely result in the volume of water and speed of it approaching Tockenham Corner increasing and is likely to make the situation worse.

Action: NO FURTHER ACTION

A3102 Culvert under main road

Reviewed photographic evidence of both dimensions of culvert and damage to the road structure due to erosion which may lead to collapse.

This is a high speed road with risk to life so would meet priority criteria

Actions: Wiltshire Council to carry out CCTV investigation of culvert and assess damage caused by erosion.

Tockenham Village Centre (Orchard Lane to Manor Farm lane)

The gulleys here have been recently cleaned. The Vactor team reported that all the drains were working properly with water flowing.

Problem areas – Some of the gulleys did have a considerable amount of detritus, however this would appear to be new.

Actions: Parish Council to monitor the gulleys

In particular:-

- Orchard Lane junction by Old Rectory Gate
- 2 gulleys at junction with Manor Farm lane

Report via MyWilts if become blocked, request visit from Discretionary Gulley Cleaning team, or ask Parish Steward to clear them.

Gulley outside Olive and Brian Fairchild's Bungalow

This was checked out and whilst it is standing proud, it would not meet criteria for intervention. The area would need to be managed eg salt if icy.

Actions: Parish Council and residents to monitor local road condition maintenance

Gulley outside Mike and Mandy Cook

There is clear evidence that the drain has dropped, possibly other issues with the highway. Parked cars are pushing vehicles over towards the wall and gulley, possibly causing the problems.

Action: Wiltshire Council to add to the maintenance list, however no timescales at

present. Will require a road closure.

General Road Surface Condition - Orchard Lane junction

There has been considerable degradation to the condition of the road surface at the junction

Action: Wiltshire Council to add a repair for this area to the highways maintenance programme.

Martin and Wencke's Greenway

A considerable amount of work has been carried out by residents and adjacent landowners.

The pipe under the road is already large, Wiltshire Council would not consider putting an additional pipe in as the road flooding does not meet intervention criteria. There is scope for additional grips to take water off road before it gets onto driveway. The watercourse in the field opposite has been dug out, but there are now detritus build ups (barms?) that need to be removed. The watercourse would benefit from being re-dug.

Actions: Parish Steward to get grips dug to take water off road on RHS coming down hill. Residents to check the situation opposite side of road during heavy rain to ascertain whether the watercourse is full or not, and report back.

Residents / Parish Council to ask farmer to revisit clearing of watercourse.

Mermaid

Still problems, flooding is causing serious deterioration of road surface/ structure. Needs proper CCTV survey (on the waiting list) with resurfacing to follow once any remedial work has been completed.

Actions: Wiltshire Council to check priority of CCTV survey.

Wiltshire Council to carry out road condition survey Tockenham Village to Breach Lane.

Tockenham Wick (site not visited, but discussed)

Flooding outside the cottages causing problems for residents leaving their homes and also degradation of road surface.

This has been discussed on many occasions previously. Surface water would need to be directed onto private land to fix this problem. Concerns have been raised about potential damage to mature trees. There are now new techniques available that could mitigate this problem. Council could use a \$100 but time consuming and legal costs.

Actions: Wiltshire Council to email KW and AB setting out the options for removing the surface water onto private land.

KW and AB to discuss with local residents once email received.

Follow up:-

Keep in touch via email and set up 2x 3-monthly Teams update meetings once the actions have been agreed.

Junction A3102 – Tockenham Corner

KW is receiving a lot of feedback from residents who are concerned about the speeding. AB advised there is not much that can be done as it is a 60mph road and the junction has good visibility.

Highways Annex table (Appendix A)
 All discussed above as part of the site visit.

10. Playing Field / Play Area

Shed Maintenance

KW advised no volunteers have come forward to carry out maintenance on the shed therefore KW would like to purchase a sprayer to apply the stain to the shed (limit of £60). This will be carried out once the foliage has died back.

Play Equipment Quotes (Appendix B)
 All members would like to thank JM for the work put into this project.

DK to submit a grant application to Community First including Appendix B as the quotes for the application. EB to provide DK with copies of the accounts to be submitted as part of the application. £20,000 from reserves to be used with £9,000 to £10,000 grant to be applied for. For the grant application double check the equipment includes a basket swing and advise in the application that the items have good sustainability principles.

RESOLVED to appoint Company A to carry out the work. Proposed by KW and seconded by NP; unanimously agreed by all who were present.

11. Rights of Way

Rights of Way Annex table (Appendix C) – to follow
 NP advised that a resident had repaired the style on TOCK8.

12. Councillor reports

DK advised there is concern about the land opposite Miracle Trees on the C120. DK to use What3Words and contact Wiltshire Council enforcement.

IC advised he had been obtaining quotes from lawyers for the acquisition of the Village Hall and surrender of the Lease. Company A in Swindon is quoted at £2,400 to £3,800 (+VAT), Company B in Chippenham is quoted at £2,100 to £2,500 (+VAT) and Company C has not provided a quote. IC will continue to chase Company C for a quote or contact a different company for a third quote.

12. Date of Next Parish Meeting: 3rd September 2025 – AB gave her apologises for the next meeting as she will be on holiday.
